FACULTY SENATE RESOLUTION 96-09

WHEREAS the ceding of fundamental rights, including the right to privacy, cannot be precondition to the employment of LSU faculty; and

WHEREAS drug testing is a severe invasion of privacy;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the LSU Faculty strongly opposes any policy which would require LSU faculty to submit to drug testing without probable cause.
