15 **PARAGRAPH 1:** WHEREAS, ALTERNATIVE SERVICE BREAK (ASB) IS A
16 RECOGNIZED STUDENT ORGANIZATION IN GOOD STANDING WITH
17 THE UNIVERSITY, AND

19 **PARAGRAPH 2:** WHEREAS, ALTERNATIVE SERVICE BREAK IS PART OF THE
20 NATIONAL NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATION BREAK AWAY, WHICH HAS
21 CHAPTERS AT UNIVERSITIES ALL OVER THE COUNTRY, AND

23 **PARAGRAPH 3:** WHEREAS, ALTERNATIVE SERVICE BREAK PROMOTES
24 COMMUNITY SERVICE AND INVOLVEMENT, LEADERSHIP AND
25 TEAMWORK, AND EDUCATION ABOUT SOCIAL ISSUES, AND

27 **PARAGRAPH 4:** WHEREAS, WHILE FORMERLY KNOWN AS ALTERNATIVE SPRING
28 BREAK AT LSU, 25 MEMBERS VISITED ATLANTA LAST APRIL AND
29 CONTRIBUTED SERVICE THROUGH HANDS ON ATLANTA, WHICH
30 CONTRIBUTED TO ASB WINNING MOST OUTSTANDING NEW
31 STUDENT ORGANIZATION AT LSU LAST SEMESTER, AND

33 **PARAGRAPH 5:** WHEREAS, THE MEMBERSHIP OF ASB HAS EXPANDED IN ORDER
34 TO ACCOMMODATE MORE STUDENTS WANTING TO PARTICIPATE,

36 **PARAGRAPH 6:** THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT GOVERNMENT
37 OF LOUISIANA STATE UNIVERSITY AND AGRICULTURAL AND
38 MECHANICAL COLLEGE TO APPROPRIATE TWO THOUSAND THREE
39 HUNDRED FIFTY-FIVE DOLLARS AND SIXTY-TWO CENTS
40 **(\$2,355.62)** TO ASB FOR TRAVEL AND LODGING.

42 **PARAGRAPH 7:** THIS BILL SHALL TAKE EFFECT UPON PASSAGE BY A THREE-
43 FOURTHS (3/4) VOTE OF THE LSU STUDENT SENATE AND
44 SIGNATURE BY THE PRESIDENT, UPON LAPSE OF TIME FOR
45 PRESIDENTIAL ACTION, OR IF VETOED BY THE PRESIDENT AND
46 SUBSEQUENTLY APPROVED BY THE SENATE, ON THE DATE OF
47 SUCH APPROVAL.

49 **PARAGRAPH 8:** ALL MONIES NOT EXPENDED BY THE END OF THE 2005 SPRING
50 ACADEMIC SEMESTER WILL REVERT TO THE SENATE GENERAL
51 CONTINGENCY. SHOULD ANY PROVISION OF ARTICLE VI
52 SECTIONS 14 THROUGH 17 OF THE STUDENT GOVERNMENT
53 BYLAWS BE VIOLATED, RIGHTS TO GRANTED FUNDING WILL BE
54 FORFEITED AND THIS BILL SHALL BECOME NULL AND VOID,
55 UNLESS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN THE RULES.
