A RESOLUTION

TO REQUEST THAT ALL FACULTY MEMBERS COMPLY WITH TEXTBOOK VENDORS REQUEST TO TURN IN BOOK ORDER FORMS BY THE VENDORS SPECIFIED DEADLINE.

PARAGRAPH 1: WHEREAS, THE PRICE OF TEXTBOOKS CONTINUES TO INCREASE, WHILE THE BUY BACK RATE CONTINUES TO DECLINE, AND

PARAGRAPH 2: WHEREAS, THIS CONTINUES TO RAISE THE COST OF EDUCATION, WHILE PUTTING STUDENTS AT AN UNFAIR ADVANTAGE AS PARTICIPANTS IN THE TEXTBOOK MARKET, AND

PARAGRAPH 3: WHEREAS, IF FACULTY MEMBERS COMPLY WITH TEXTBOOK VENDORS REQUEST TO TURN IN BOOK ORDER FORMS BY A SPECIFIED DEADLINE BOOK COMPANIES COULD BUY BACK MORE BOOKS AT A HIGHER RATE AND HAVE MORE USED BOOKS TO SELL TO STUDENTS, AND

PARAGRAPH 4: WHEREAS, THIS IS AN ACHIEVABLE WAY OF LOWERING THE COST OF EDUCATION FOR STUDENTS.

PARAGRAPH 5: THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE STUDENT GOVERNMENT REQUESTS THAT ALL FACULTY MEMBERS COMPLY WITH TEXTBOOK VENDORS REQUEST TO TURN IN BOOK ORDER FORMS BY THE VENDORS SPECIFIED DEADLINE.
